Key Concepts in BMS

- ◆ Respect and support the patient in his/her healthcare decisions
- ◆ Blood Conservation
 - Micro-sampling
 - Cell salvage
- ◆ Aggressive and prompt treatment
- ◆ Pharmacological management of anemia

Benefits of a BMS Program

- ◆ Decreased donor blood use
- ◆ Decreased post-op infection rates
- ◆ Avoid potential exposure to viral and bacterial infections
- ◆ Decreased length of stay
- ◆ Greater patient satisfaction

The BMSP Nurse Manager is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Call (908) 994-5458 or page the Manager at (877) 354-9828 for information or assistance.

The BMSP Nurse Manager should be called for any patient enrolled in the program if any of the following conditions occur:

- ◆ A BMS patient is admitted to your area and his/her diagnosis or condition is unstable, or if your patient is anemic.
- ◆ There is a change in a BMS patient's status (i.e. becomes unstable, death).
- ◆ Patient - family crisis intervention.
- ◆ To answer questions of staff, patient or family regarding the bloodless program.
- ◆ A BMS patient is scheduled for surgery or a procedure.
- ◆ Blood or blood products are being considered for any BMS patient, including minor children or pregnant women enrolled in the BMSP.
- ◆ A BMS patient chooses to withdraw from the BMS Program.

Patient Identification:

Category One: NO BLOOD (transfusion free)

Category Two: BLOOD CONSERVATION PROGRAM

- ◆ *Each category will be identified by a corresponding armband which is to be worn by the patient in addition to his/her hospital identification armband. This armband is to remain with the patient throughout the hospital stay.*
- ◆ *A "No Blood" placard is placed at the head of patient's bed.*
- ◆ *A BMSP Medical Directive Sticker is placed on the outside spine of the patient's chart.*
